NOTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

The notes of the meeting held on 1st March 2004 were accepted as a correct record.

MATTERS ARISING

Steve Miles reported that the Constitution was now almost complete.

TRANSPORT OPERATIONS MANAGER, GLOUCESTERSHIRE CC

Unfortunately the transport Operations Manager was unable to attend the meeting. The item for discussion will be held over until the next meeting when he will be able to attend. Council members agreed that they should draw up a list of questions to be submitted to the Transport Operations Manager in advance so that he can come to the next meeting with full answers.

The main points raised by members were:

YOUTH CABINET MEETING
