#### **1. Welcome and Apologies**

The Chair welcomed members to the meeting, especially those attending for the first time. Apologies are listed on the record above.

# 2. Minutes of the Last Meeting – 25<sup>th</sup> February 2019

The minutes of the last meeting were agreed to be a true and accurate record with the agreed changes made to item 8 b) regarding sexual health promotion having ceased about 8 years ago and the number of members interested in gaining more knowledge. *Proposed by Tom Wickham-Bassett; Seconded by: Thomas Haynes.* 

## 3. Matters Arising

- a) Youth Voice Star Award: National Ceremony Outcome Helen and Lily attended with Steve and gave an brief overview of the event that took place in London.
- b) SDYC Leadership meeting with SDC Group Leaders on 14 March Tom Haynes reported on the meeting with SDC political alliance group leaders. Members discussed the following:
  - Lowering the voting age to 16 and progress since SDC supportive motion was passed last year.
  - Changing the voter registration process, a number of suggestions inc. communication via council tax bills, SDC news with an insert regarding voter registration and possibly create step by step video guide of how to sign up.
  - Mental health and emotional wellbeing, particularly regarding stress and school pressure; members learnt of SDC mental health champions, Cllr's Jim Duey and Tom Skinner. Encouraged to talk to County Councilors – Cllrs Eva Ward and Steve Robinson are likely to be interested and are also district councilors.
  - Anti–Bullying encouraged to speak to school governors.
  - Youth Friendly GP surgeries members highlighted development of a framework with GP's and Commissioners.
  - Researching Sexual Health Services particular attention to condom distribution scheme (C-Card)

Members felt it was a very positive meeting and was good to develop a relationship with respective Councillors. It was felt the points discussed should be built into future SDYC project work.

#### c) SDC CSL Committee Presentation on 21 March 2019

Feedback from members included; that it was interesting to see and hear debate and decision making. Presentation on youth service and youth voice work was good.

#### Creating an Anti-Bullying Policy

# Sexual Health Services

To Propose: that youth forum representatives are invited to the sexual health training on the 1<sup>st</sup> of April. Youth Friendly GP Surgeries

To note: that the presentation to the Stroud and Berkeley Vale GP Forum will be on the 11<sup>th</sup> April. Stroud Hospital of Friends

To note: we discussed sitting on Stroud Hospital Friends Board, but we will wait for further information on the role.

Proposed by: Issy Llewellyn. Report seconded by: Thomas Haynes. The report was approved.

# 6. Constitution Changes

a) Manifesto Document – proposed by: Issy Llewellyn. Seconded by: Leon Linton-Blake

Motion: 'The youth council will produce a manifesto document which will be subject to amendment and agreed annually at the annual general meeting. It will contain formally agreed views from the membership and pro-active statements and will subsequently form the policy for projects, initiatives and campaigns to be worked upon throughout the ensuing year'.

Members were reminded that changes to constitution, require further approval at the AGM. An accompanying document was shared with examples, as follows;

- SDYC believes that the voting age in local and national elections and referenda should be lowered to aged 16 and subsequently supports the national votes at 16 campaigns.
- SDYC believes that reform of the voter registration system should take place principally moving from a current 'opt-in' system to one that enables people to 'opt-out'
- SDYC will strive to have greater involvement in SDC decision-making on matters of concern to young people
- SDYC will work with NHS Clinical Commissioning Group to improve mental health and emotional wellbeing
- SDYC believe that young people should be able to access good quality sexual health education and services. SDYC will work with Gloucestershire County Council's commissioned provider to improve sexual health services and reduce STIs.
- SDYC Members will be offered mental health first aid training on an annual basis
- SDYC believes that students should have access to good quality school nursing
- SDYC will work with NHS Clinical Commissioning Group and local GP surgeries to create a framework that enables surgeries to meet the needs to young people
- SDYC will consult with the youth population of the district regarding their experiences of bullying in schools, communities and homes with view to developing a future anti-bullying campaign

This motion was agreed upon and will be presented to the AGM.

*b)* Election of Officers & Leaders – minimum term of service – *Proposed by: Issy Llewellyn. Seconded by: Maxie Wells.* 

Motion: 'A minimum term of six months service as an SDYC member is required prior to being nominated for a position of office or leadership.'

This motion was amended to read: 'A minimum term as an SDYC member of six months service for Chair, Vice Chair and Leader and a minimum term as an SDYC member of three months for Principal Member and BYC representative roles, is required prior to being nominated for a position of office or leadership.' This motion was agreed upon and will be presented to the AGM.
