Minutes of Youth Council meeting held on the 19 November 2007

Welcome & Apologies

The chair welcomed new members and visitors to Stroud Youth Centre. Apologies were received from Becky Batting, Alex Jones, Kieran Nurding, Sian Ainsworth and Harriet Dudbridge, Cllr. John Jefferys.

Minutes of the last meeting

The minutes of the last meeting held on the 29 October were agreed to be a true and accurate record.

Matters arising

SDC Budget Consultation Feedback – members handed in consultation questionnaires to be collated and forwarded to SDC Finance department.

Correspondence

Design logo for Activity Club for Everyone – at the meeting Steve gave the group a chance to design a logo for ACE (Activity Club for Everyone). This club provides children and young people with physical, sensory and learning difficulties opportunity to participate in a variety of mainstream and adapted sports, physical activity, and dance and to play in a safe, fun and inclusive environment. It was agreed that Youth Councillors could work by you or in teams to design a logo for this group – the closing date for entries is December 15.

Rural Youth Network consultation – Post Office Closures – members were asked if they would like to complete a questionnaire on the closures of Post Offices. It was decided that due to the limited time before the deadline this would only be able to be done on a personal basis.

Children's fund consultation – flooding in Gloucestershire – members were made aware of the consultation being done by The Children's Fund regarding the summer floods in Gloucestershire and were encouraged to consider this.

Gloucestershire 1000 millennium – plant a tree – As it is Gloucestershire's Millennium (1000 years old) the Youth Council have been asked if they would like to be involved in helping plant 1000 trees. Whilst it was considered by some as a good idea, members were asked to give feedback on the information pack which would be available at the next meeting.

Letter from Hilary Fowles – Night Bus, Cam & Dursley Link – A letter had been received from Councillor Hilary Fowles regarding the night bus service link from Cam & Dursley. SDYC were being asked to pledge their support to a letter being drafted to the County Council asking them to increase their involvement in supporting the service. Since receiving this, Cam & Dursley Youth Forum had taken up this position of support from young people and therefore it was considered that no further support was needed. However it was noted that SDYC we actively involved in the Night Bus management.

Litter Recycling Pilot Project – Presentation and workshop by Gemma Steger

Gemma from Public Spaces Department at Stroud District Council attended the meeting to discuss the litter recycling project. The youth council obtained a £20,000 grant from the LSP to place tribins in an area of Stroud district to encourage the recycling of litter at source. It was discussed where the youth council thought the bins should go, highlighting that the original idea was to link with a school and a community. Gemma stated that it would have to be somewhere where it was easy for Service Team to collect the litter. Youth Councillors suggested the following areas;

Supermarkets Cainscross Road, Stroud Near Rednock School, Dursley Maidenhill School, Stonehouse Marling School have expressed an interest Thomas Keble School & Eastcombe Bank Gardens, Stroud Town.

It was agreed that a visit to each site would be needed to explore the value of each one and feasibility. El agreed to meet with Steve to draft a criteria check list for the visits. Dates would be arranged in due course.

Points to consider included; the type of bin, what they should look like and the inclusion of the SDYC logo.

Proud of Stroud

Steve informed the members that they had been asked to deliver a presentation for staff at Stroud District Council to 'showcase' the work that they are currently doing and to educate the staff on the youth council in itself. Members who were interested in this are Emma, Jess, Alex, El and Nat.

Youth Cabinet Report

Freddie reported that the Youth Cabinet would like to propose a change to the end of year deadline for the Youth Initiative Fund. Currently it is 31 March, which leaves zero time to process each application from agreement by SDYC to payment being received by the applicant – this can take up to 8 weeks. It was agreed that the new end of year deadline would be 31 December, starting this year.

Stroud Night Bus Report

The Cam and Dursley route has been suspended due to a variety of issues previously reported but it was included in the latest tender invitations sent out. The results will be available on 5th December at the next SNB meeting.

Canal Restoration Project - update

Natalie and Steve went to a meeting about the outcome of the Living Landmarks grant from the Big Lottery Fund. It was report by Nat that the bid to the Big Lottery by the Cotswold Canals Project for regenerating the section known as '1b' from Stonehouse to Saul was (despite being in the last 9 of 400) unsuccessful on this occasion.

Stroud District Youth Council has become a keen supporter of this huge local project and played a key role in the bidding process and is looking to continue its partnership work.

Hear by Right update

A mapping & planning event took place on 16th November, involving up to 6 youth councillors, adult cabinet members, strategic team and senior officers from SDC. The day went well and the staff turnout and feedback was very good. Progress will be made on this in the near future.

Duke of Edinburgh - Accreditation

Steve reported that accreditation for the work carried out by Stroud District Youth Councillors was needed. He outlined a number of different types of accreditation and informed everyone that this was an important area of his work in which to make progress on. The Duke of Edinburgh Awards would feature highly as a nationally and internationally recognised award for young people.

Waste, Recycling and Street Cleaning Facts and figures

- How many tonnes of waste does the UK produce each year? 434 Million – This is enough waste to fill the Albert Hall every 2 hours
- What percentage of this figure do you think goes to landfill? 73% - even though 90% of this is recyclable
- How many years worth of space do you think is left in Gloucestershire's landfill sites? 12 Years – but this is decreasing rapidly as more waste is being produced
- Household waste is on the increase each year, by what percentage?
 - 3% this may not sound like much but it means our waste will double by 2020
- How much waste does each household in the Stroud District produce each year? 1 tonne – the size of a small elephant
- How many Millions are spent by Local Authorities on Street Cleaning and Litter Clearance? £500 million
- How many tonnes of litter does the average person drop each year in the UK? 0.5 Tonnes of litter dropped by average person & most littering occur with in 5 meters of litterbin
- What percentage of refuse in the average bin in the UK is Food Waste? 26% of waste in bin is food waste
- How much energy is saved when recycling aluminium can? 95% energy is saved – can
- Approximately, how many kilometres of road are cleaned by Stroud District Council? 2200Km of highway is swept in Stroud District – which is the equivalent distance from Stroud to Rome
